- 1. **bob and whee**l: The first part of each stanza does not rhyme but does use alliteration, and it may be anywhere from 12 to 36 lines long, but the second part of each stanza is always five lines long (the bob and wheel) and rhymes *ababa*. The "bob," the first of the five lines, is only two syllables long; but the remaining four lines (the wheel) would contain longer lines that not only rhymed but usually contain alliteration as well.
